M4 relief road: Land ownership influence denied

Claims of a flawed process when choosing the new route for the £1bn M4 relief road around Newport have been rejected by the economy minister.

BBC Wales has learned the Welsh government owns more than £12m worth of property along the so-called black route. Edwina Hart denied it influenced her decision in favour of that option.

Public Accounts Committee chair Darren Millar has asked whether taxpayers have had value for money from land purchase.

The BBC's Week In Week Out programme found that as well as owning £12m worth of property, land and farms along the black route, the Welsh government had spent more than £20m in professional fees to consultants since 1998.

Mrs Hart's denial of any undue influence came in response to questions from AMs in the Senedd on Tuesday.

Liberal Democrat AM Eluned Parrott asked what the value was of a public consultation or the forthcoming public inquiry "if behind the scenes the Welsh government was buying the land to make one specific route possible".

Tory AM Nick Ramsay said there were "major holes in this whole process" and that the public and AMs were "losing confidence".

Packham Slams Bushtucker Trials

Chris Packham described the show's bushtucker trials as "barbaric" and "silly"

TV presenter Chris Packham has penned an open letter to Ant and Dec - calling for the pair to step in and end the "abuse of animals" on I'm A Celebrity... Get Me Out Of Here!.

The ITV jungle show returns on Sunday with a new line-up of celebrities, including Allo Allo! actress Vicki Michelle and former motorcycle world champion Carl Fogarty, facing spiders, snakes and cockroaches in the bushtucker trials.

Packham told the duo: "But then, let's face it, as we all know, you couldn't let that happen anyway. It's a sham."

He wrote: "The problem is that animals such as snakes, spiders, crocodiles, rats and many invertebrates are already misunderstood and thus unfortunately vilified, despite the incredibly important roles they play in the world's ecosystems and our lives.

"By orchestrating a fear of them among your contestants, I'm afraid you're reinforcing and exaggerating a terrible ignorance and intolerance of these remarkable animals."

He wrote: "What particularly frustrates me is that this counters and undoes all the education that I and my colleagues strive to achieve in our natural history programmes.

"Lads, it's not all about the cute and the cuddly; every species plays a role and until we can all see the importance of this, we won't make the urgent progress we need to in conservation."

He said of the ITV show's large audience: "Just imagine getting them all to respect these creatures rather than continue to be unnecessarily revolted by them. Surely that is something you could be genuinely proud of?"

Packham dismissed I'm A Celebrity's use of consultants to advise on animal welfare, saying: "I can guarantee that some animals are harmed during production, because they are fragile or easily stressed. Or simply killed, as they are in your Bushtucker trials."

He criticised the "mockery" of insects being eaten on I'm A Celebrity... when in some parts of the world "invertebrates are routinely eaten without repulsion - normally because there is no choice".

The presenter accused the show of teaching "younger viewers ... that killing things for plain exploitative 'entertainment' is acceptable."

Packham added: "I'm sorry, but that is a shame that I imagine neither of you will want to take to your graves, because I assure you that your grandchildren will not thank you for it.

Dear Robert,

Many thanks for your enquiry. Measurements of wind and ice extent in Antarctica are extremely difficult due to the remoteness and harshness of the region. Data records exist but are extremely sparse and insufficient to give a full insight into changes over the whole continent. The introduction of satellites have allowed the Antarctic to be observed in more detail, and recent studies of Antarctic sea-ice motion have greatly advanced our understanding of it's large scale dynamics. There remain issues though, such as the data records being so short along with different sensors being installed on individual satellites which makes it difficult to compare data.

A study has been recently carried out aimed at overcoming these issues, and used consistent data from the period 1992-2010. It was published in the scientific journal 'nature' and the reference is: Holland P. R and Kwok R. (2012), Wind-driven trends in Antarctic sea-ice drift, nature, Vol 5, pp872-875.

If you do not subscribe to this journal then you may be charged to access it, though it will be freely available at your local library. It goes into great detail and covers the processes at work which have resulted in an increase in Antarctic sea-ice. It concludes that observed ice motion and winds are highly correlated which implies that ice-motion trends are largely caused by wind trends. It quantifies dynamic and thermodynamic processes in the internal ice pack and shows that wind-driven changes in ice advection are the dominant driver of ice-concentration trends around West Antarctica, whereas wind-driven thermodynamic changes dominate elsewhere.

I'm not sure if you are aware, but the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) Assessment Report 5 (AR5) was released last year and is freely available. It provides a summary of the current science, with Working Group 1 (WGI) of the report focussing on the physical science, with chapter 4 on the Cryosphere and has a section on Antarctica which has further information. Thank you for your interest and concern.

We are aware that some reports about whaling in the Faroe Islands can be very disturbing when presented out of context. We are therefore grateful for this opportunity to provide you with a factual explanation of the role and organisation of the whale drive in Faroese society today and the measures in place to regulate it.

Pilot whales and other small whales are utilised for food in the Faroe Islands and represent one of very few local sources of meat that does not have to be imported from afar. Both the meat and blubber of pilot whales have for centuries been a staple part of the national diet.

The total number of pilot whales taken in the Faroe Islands can fluctuate from one year to the next. The long-term average catch of around 800 whales a year is not considered to have a significant impact on the abundance of pilot whales in the Northeast Atlantic, which are estimated to number around 128,000. Faroese whaling is therefore widely recognised as a sustainable catch.

Whale drives in the Faroe Islands can happen several times year in all seasons, although most commonly in the summer months. The driving, beaching, killing and distribution of pilot whales are fully regulated by law and regulations. Catches are shared on a community basis among the participants in a whale drive and residents of the local district where the whales are beached.
